Audience

Style

Quotations and References

If you are using quotations, identify the sources. Depending on their length, it may be necessary to obtain permission for them to be used, so please give full information. If you quote references, give full bibliographic information.

Length and Format of Articles

Articles should generally be 1500-2500 words in length. We do accept shorter or longer articles, but we suggest a query e-mail first if your article is shorter or longer. All articles must be original and not have been previously published.

It is probably a good idea to send a query e-mail first describing your proposed article in a paragraph to the editor. Articles should be submitted electronically in Word to editor@languagemagazine.com
