

# Russian Immersion

Christine Tsai suggests destinations to learn the language of Tolstoy

**Russia, also known as the Russian Federation**, is a transcontinental country extending across Eurasia. Made up of 46 provinces and 21 republics, Russia is the largest country in the world, and consists of more than 142 million people who nearly all speak Russian. While Russian is the official state language, there are currently 27 co-official native languages throughout the republics.

As Russia is such a vast country, students have many options as to where they can learn the language, but the majority of schools are based in Moscow and St. Petersburg. Moscow, the capital of Russia, is a vibrant and dynamic city where students can visit Red Square or the Kremlin. The Kremlin, which has always been perceived as a symbol of power and might of the Russian state with the national idea expressed in stone, stands high on the hill towering over the left bank of Moskva River.

St. Petersburg boasts of 342 bridges to pass over its 800 canals, rivers, and lakes. Here, students will be overwhelmed by architectural monuments, such as the Peter & Paul Fortress, the Decembrists' Square with the monument of Peter the Great, St. Isaac's Cathedral, and Isaakiyevskaya Square. This is also home to the largest fountain in the world, the Grand Cascade, which is just one of 200 fountains located throughout the city.
